## ASSAULTS

## CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Overnight on November 20/21 in Woodlands Road, Netley Marsh, seven cars had their rear windows smashed by means unknown. Nothing was stolen.

Around Lyndhurst damage was caused to three sheds, one of which belonged to the Infant School in Lyndhurst. Three youths have been dealt with for the damage.

A car parked outside the

Mailmans in Lyndhurst was broken into and a set of Golf Clubs were stolen.

The only other incident was at the Ashurst Child and Family Centre. Offenders tried to force the window by removing the beading.

## THEFT OF VEHICLE

A garage was broken into in Romsey Road, Lyndhurst and a child's Quad bike was stolen.

Two people have been arrested and dealt with for breaking into and stealing property from the Post Office and stores in the High Street, Lyndhurst.

Males were riding mopeds in and around the community in Woodlands Road.

They also urinated over the equipment in the play area.

A group of youths caused distress to a 94 year old woman in the Meadows, Lyndhurst by knocking on her door and carol singing. The youths have been warned about this.
