Burglary

We are pleased to report that there were no reports of dwelling burglaries again this month.

Burglary – non dwelling

A store room was forced open at a golf club in Lyndhurst. The offenders removed a tractor and tried to steal diesel but nothing was taken.

A contractor working in Beaulieu Road, Lyndhurst had his wallet stolen from his truck. Please remember to remove all valuables from your vehicle before leaving it unattended.

A Moped was stolen from a house in Pikes Hill, Lyndhurst. Fortunately, it was recovered nearby.

Criminal damage

A restaurant in Ashurst had a window smashed.

Theft

£260 was stolen from an open till in a restaurant in Lyndhurst.
