Current Safer Neighbourhoods team priorities include:

1. Reducing non-dwelling burglaries
2. Patrolling New Forest car parks to help reduce vehicle crime.

### Rowdy and Inconsiderate behaviour

There was a spate of rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour in the Ashurst area last month. Over the course of two weeks, two motor vehicles were damaged and rubbish was thrown into the road. Hedges were also climbed over.

In response to this we conducted extra patrols. A group of youths were seen following a further call from a member of the public. There was no evidence to connect them to the offences that had been committed but we took their details and called their parents to ask them to collect them. We will continue to increase police presence in the area.

There were 77 reported incidents in March.

### Burglary and thefts

A house was entered by forcing the rear window in Bank and several items were stolen.

A shop in Lyndhurst had a window smashed in the early hours of the morning and items were stolen. Two people have been arrested in connection with the offence and the stolen property has been recovered.

In a separate incident, a man stole two televisions from a shop in Lyndhurst.

### Assault

Two men have been arrested and charged after police officers were assaulted in Ashurst when attempting to break up a fight. The fight was between two friends as they left a local pub.

### Vehicle Crime

Four motor vehicles were broken into in Andrew Mares car park between 11.30am and 1pm on March 28. All had their windows smashed and two hand bags were stolen.

Three motor vehicles parked in Lyndhurst car park were damaged on the evening of March 27, between 6pm and 11.15pm. It is thought this was caused by someone scratching the panels with a sharp instrument. If you saw anything suspicious on either day then please contact us and report it.
