Burglary

We are pleased to report that there were no reports of dwelling burglaries this month.

Burglary – non dwelling

A chainsaw and garden equipment were stolen after garages were entered in the secluded area of Emery Down. A garage was also entered in Ringwood Road and four sacks of scrap metal were stolen. Two mountain bikes were stolen from a garage in Chestnut Drive, Ashurst.

Assault

All of the assaults reported this month were of a domestic nature and have been investigated by the police.

Theft from motor vehicles

There were six vehicles broken into in May. Five of these were cars parked at public house car parks in Ashurst. The sixth car was parked at Vinney Ridge. The rear window was smashed and a bag was stolen from the boot. Please remember to remove all valuables from your vehicles. Even hiding them in the boot or under the seat is not enough, as often the thieves are waiting and watching people as they leave their vehicles.
