Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Targeting crime and Anti-Social behaviour

Total incidents reported: Ashurst – 14 of which 3 were crimes. Lyndhurst - 39 of which 9 were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages, driving complaints and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – Ashurst (2) There was a report of fly tipping and inconsiderate parking. Lyndhurst (2) There was a report of people having an open fire in Boldrewood car park and also patrons acting in an anti-social manner when leaving a licensed premise.

Assaults – Ashurst (0) Lyndhurst (1) There was an allegation of assault following a domestic incident.

Burglary – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (0). *Please report any suspicious people you see day and night.*

Burglary (non dwelling) – Ashurst (1) A commercial premise was broken into. Lyndhurst (0). *Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.*

Criminal Damage – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (3) A car was scratched at a local school; A police car window was smashed and a police cell damaged.

Drugs – Ashurst (0) Lyndhurst (0)

Public Order – Ashurst (1) A male caused problems at a licensed premise. Lyndhurst (0)

Road traffic collisions – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (6) Minor injuries suffered.

Road traffic incidents – Ashurst (3) Three drivers were summonsed for speeding. Lyndhurst (3) Three people were summonsed for speeding offences.

Theft – Ashurst (2) Thefts occurred at two commercial premise. Lyndhurst (5) Three occurred at commercial premise and two from residences.

Theft from vehicles – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (1) A vehicle was broken into in a Forest car park. *Please ensure you secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*

Speed watch – A total of 518 vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in March. Of those, 91 (17.5%) motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit. Please get in touch with us if you would like further details regarding the recorded data and the action taken by police.
