Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Our current priorities are tackling crime and Anti-social behaviour

Total incidents reported: Ashurst & Netley Marsh – 23 of which 4 were crimes. Lyndhurst - 48 of which 14 were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – A & NM (4) There were four reports of inconsiderate behaviour. Lyndhurst (1) There was a report of inconsiderate behaviour on the High Street.

Assaults – A & NM (1) A male was assaulted following a dispute. Lyndhurst (1) There was an incident at a local home.

Burglary – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (0) *Please report any suspicious people you see day and night.*

Burglary (non dwelling) – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (0) *Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.*

Criminal Damage – A & NM (2) In separate incidents a car and house window were damaged in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (4) Three vehicles were damaged and a sign was damaged in Emery Down.

Drugs – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (2) Following her arrest a female was subsequently found to have cannabis on her and a driver was stopped and found to be in possession of cannabis.

Public Order – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (1) People were abusive in Emery Down.

Road traffic collisions – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (7) Two persons suffered injuries and a pony was injured.

Road traffic collisions – A & NM (2) A cyclist was injured in Ashurst and a vehicle was damaged in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (8) Two cyclists suffered injuries and a pony was injured.

Road traffic incidents – A & NM (0) Lyndhurst (5) Five drivers were summonsed for speeding offences.

Theft – A & NM (1) An animal was reported taken and was later found nearby. Lyndhurst (3) Two occurred at commercial premise and a bike was taken but later located.

Theft from vehicles – A & NM (0). Lyndhurst (1) A vehicle was broken in to in a Forest car park. *Please ensure you continue to secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*

Speed watch – A total of 1693 vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in September. Of those, 730 (43.1%) motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit.
