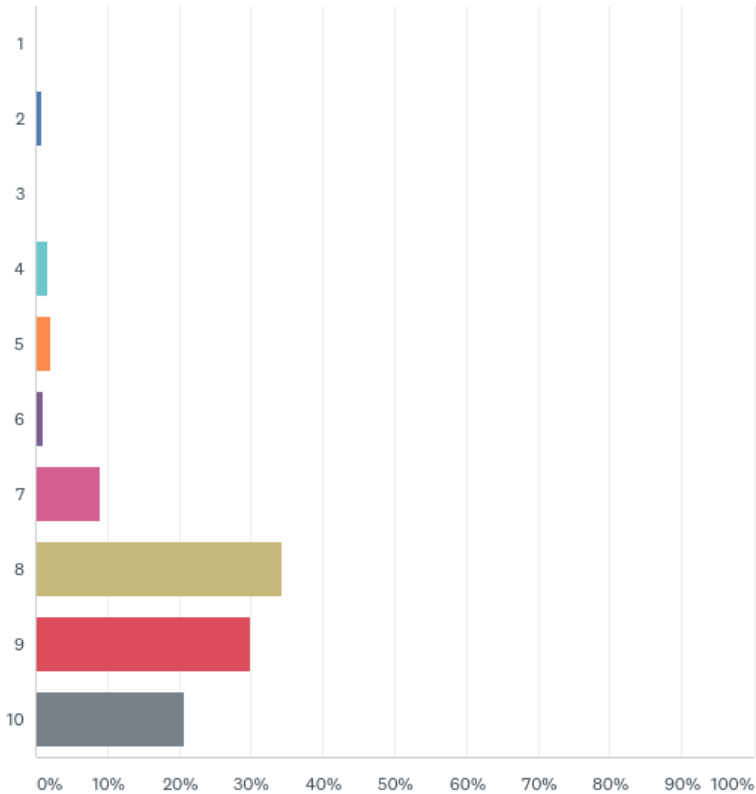
## The Parish Questionnaire – Why?

---

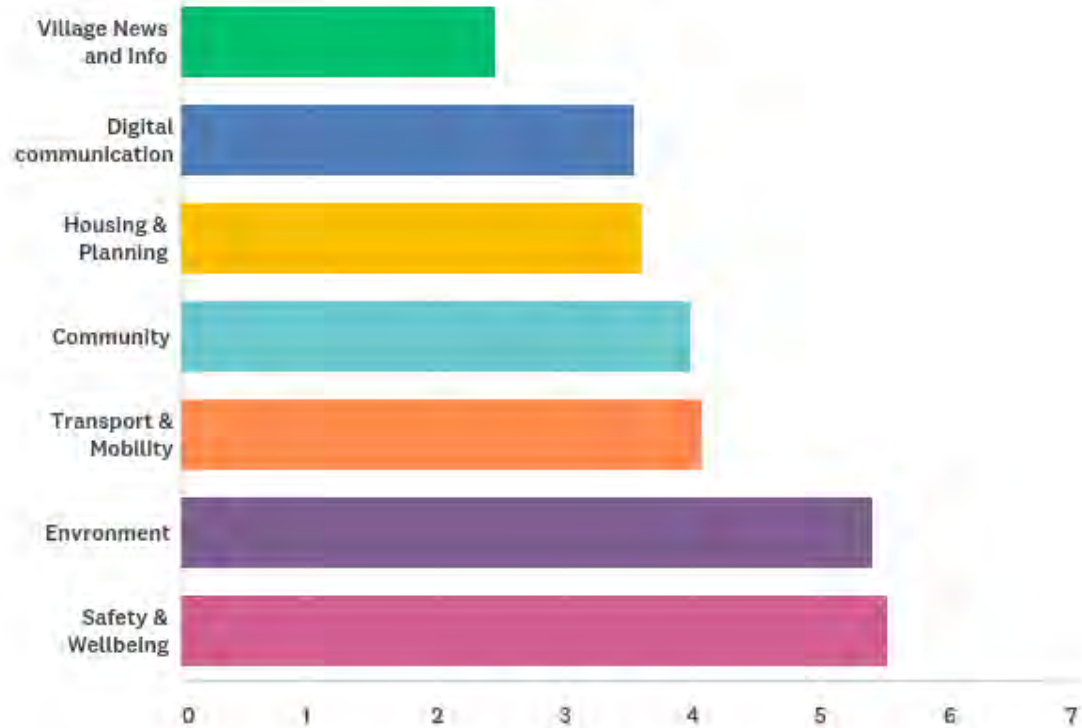
To guide the Parish Council in setting, prioritising and delivering a 10 year Parish Plan.

## Q2: Please rank in order of importance to you the following aspects of living in Ashurst & Colbury (1=most important, 7= least important).





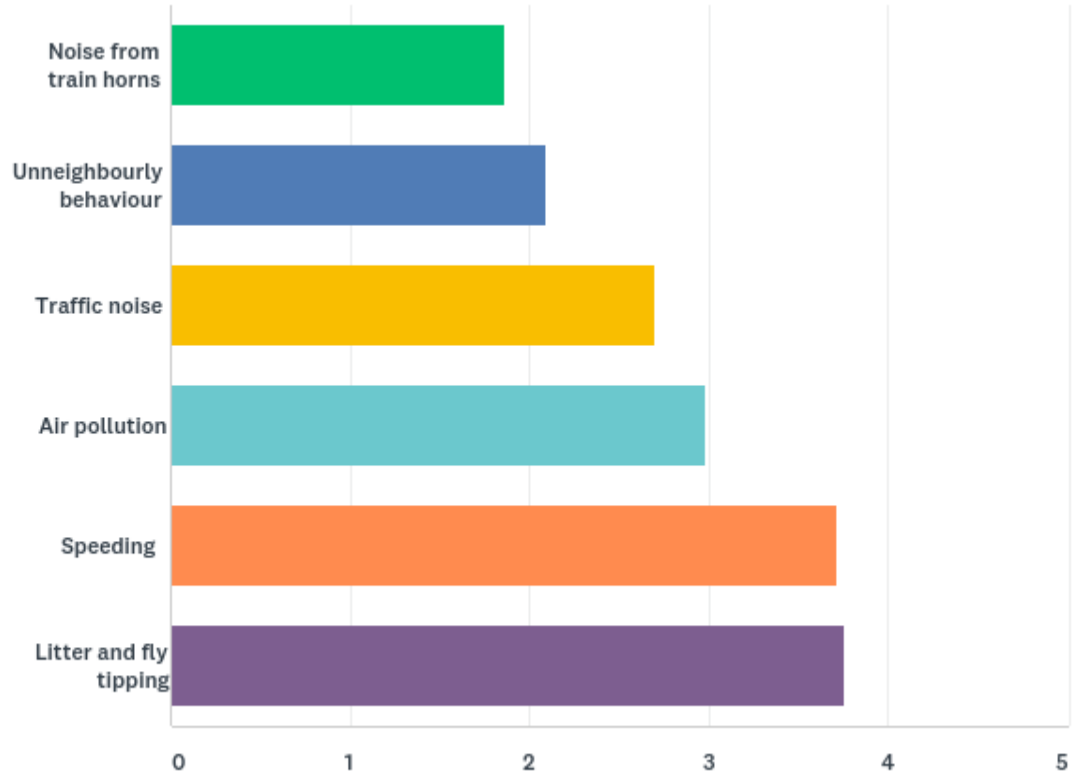

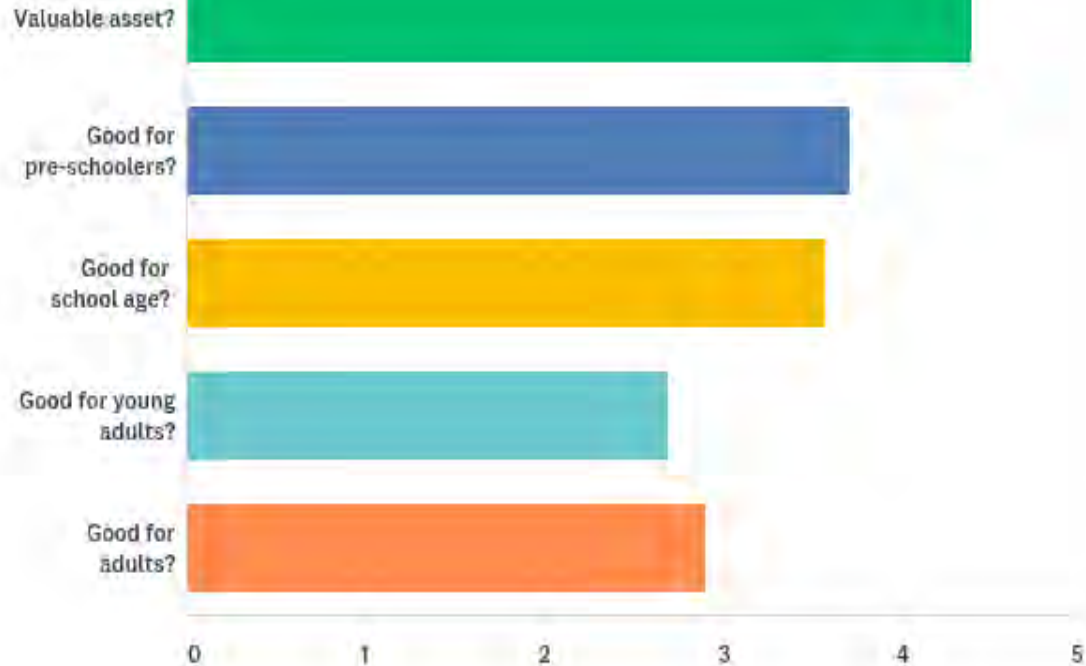

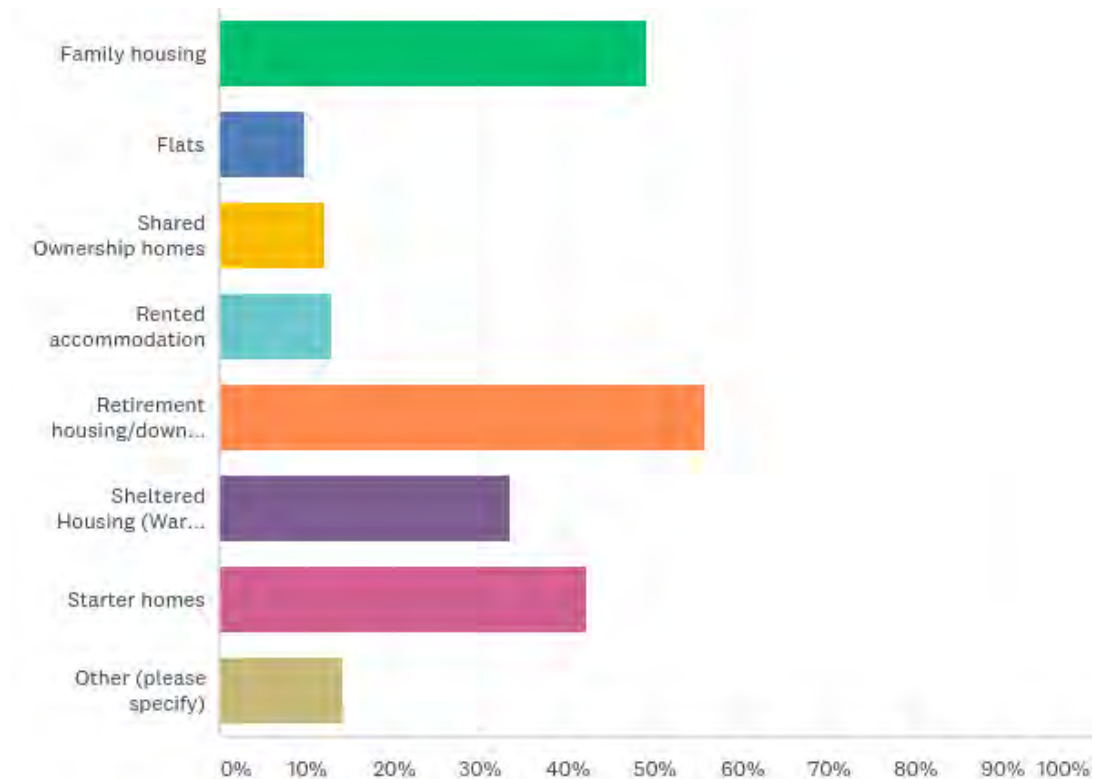


## Q7: How much do you agree with the view that Ashurst & Colbury is a safe place to live?

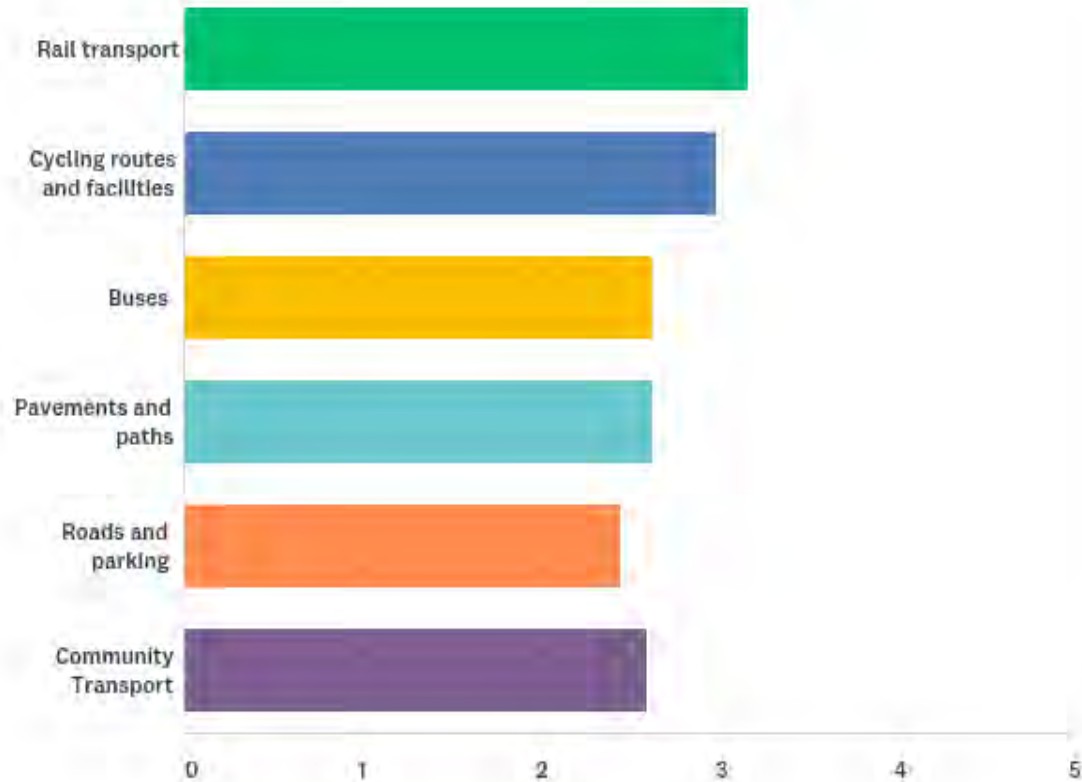

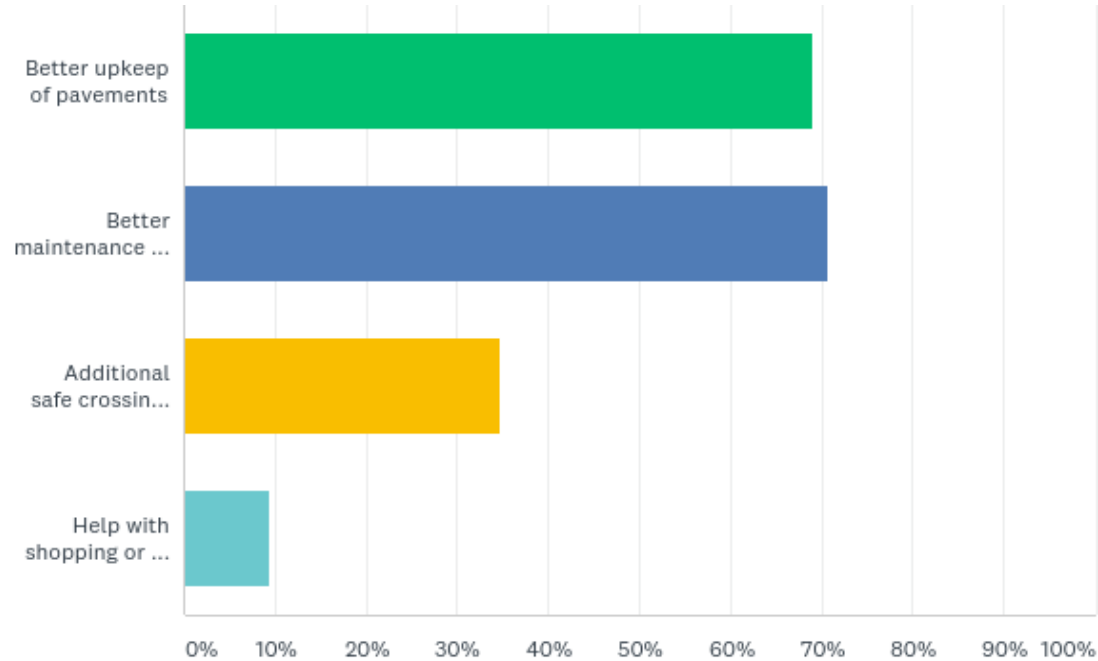




## Q11-14: Satisfaction levels with village transportation and access



## Q15: If you find it difficult to fully access and enjoy village life, what would improve things for you?



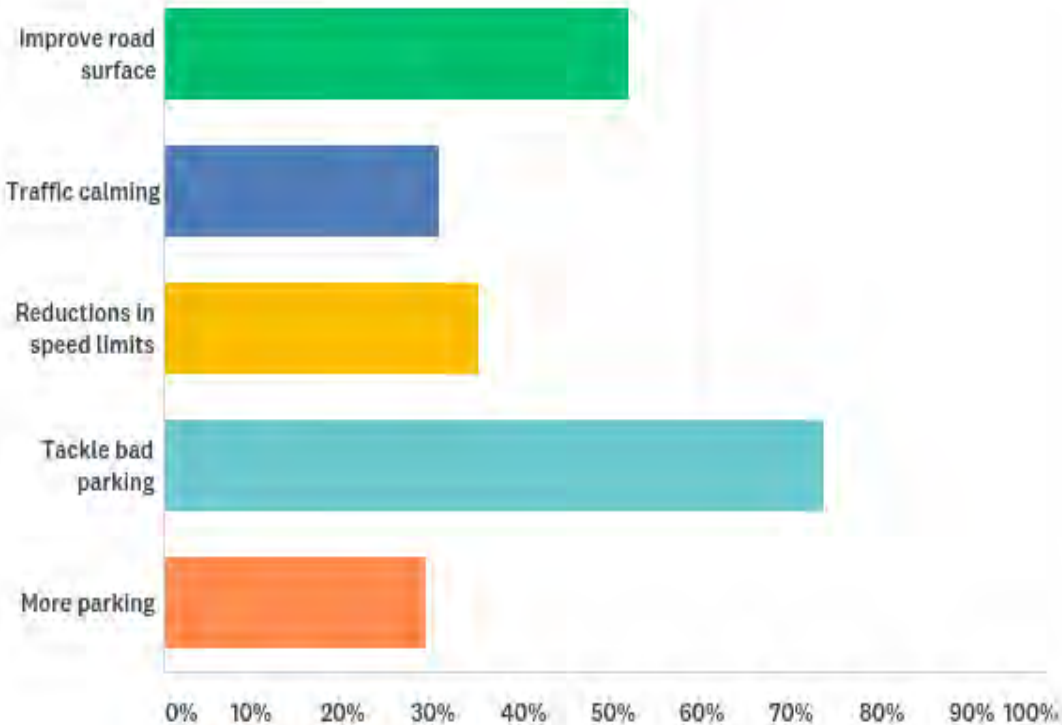

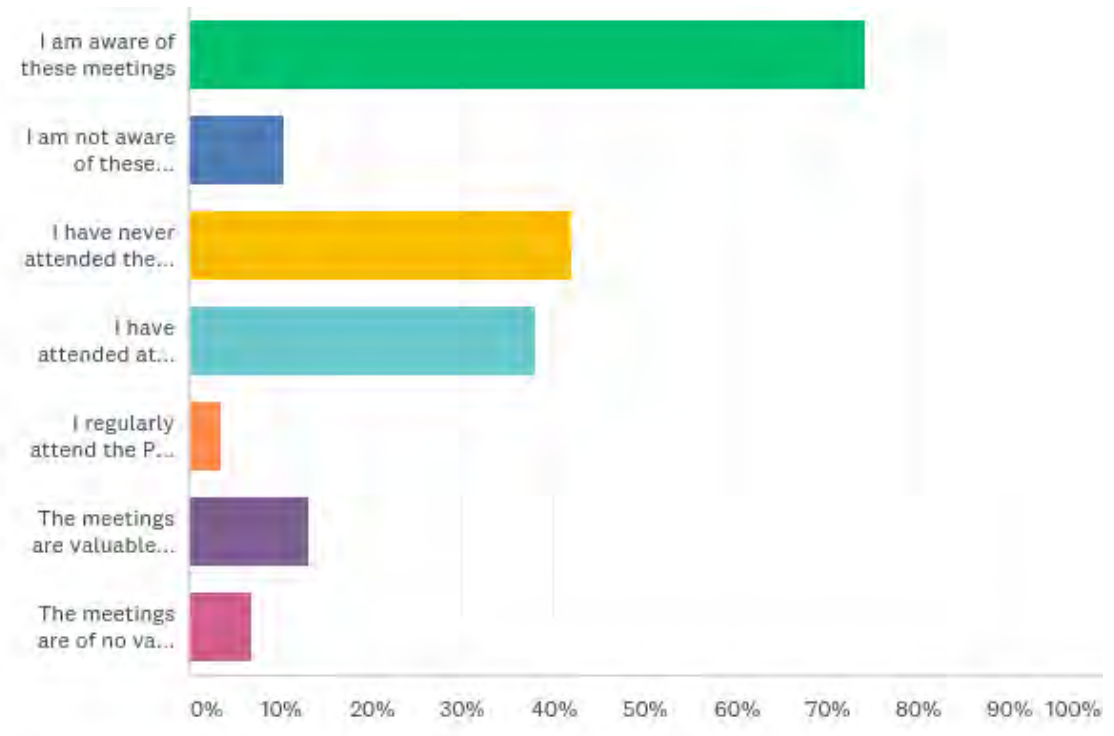
# Q16: If you are not satisfied with the current provision of roads and parking, what changes would you like to see?





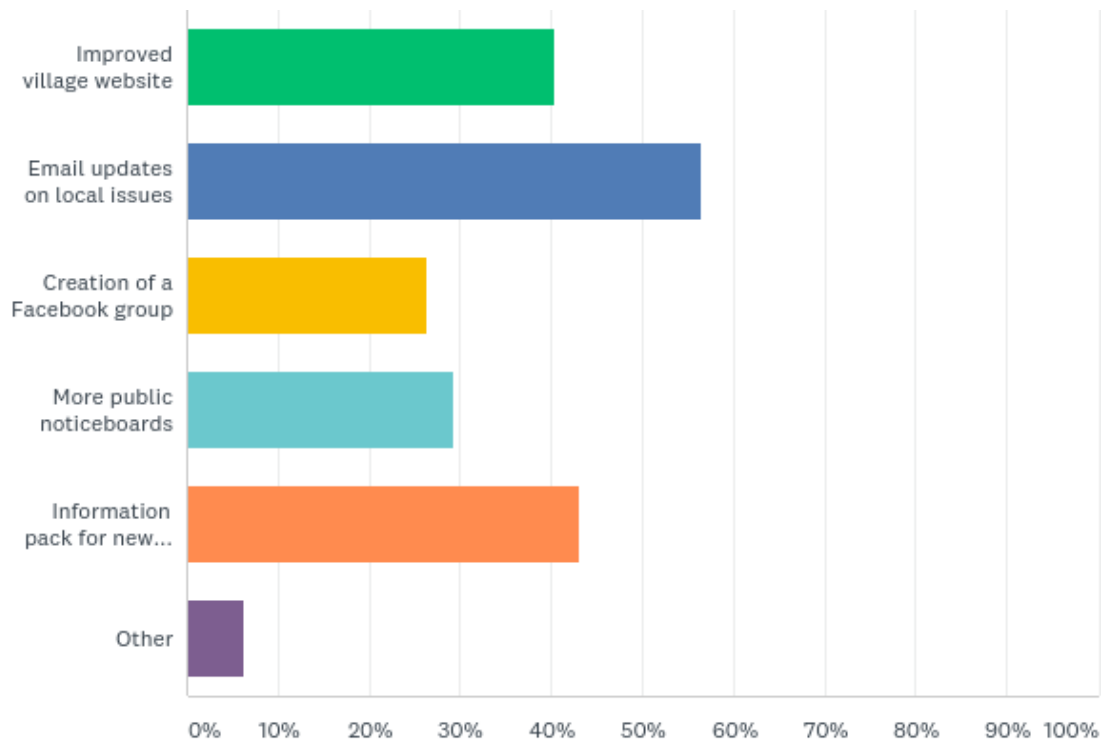

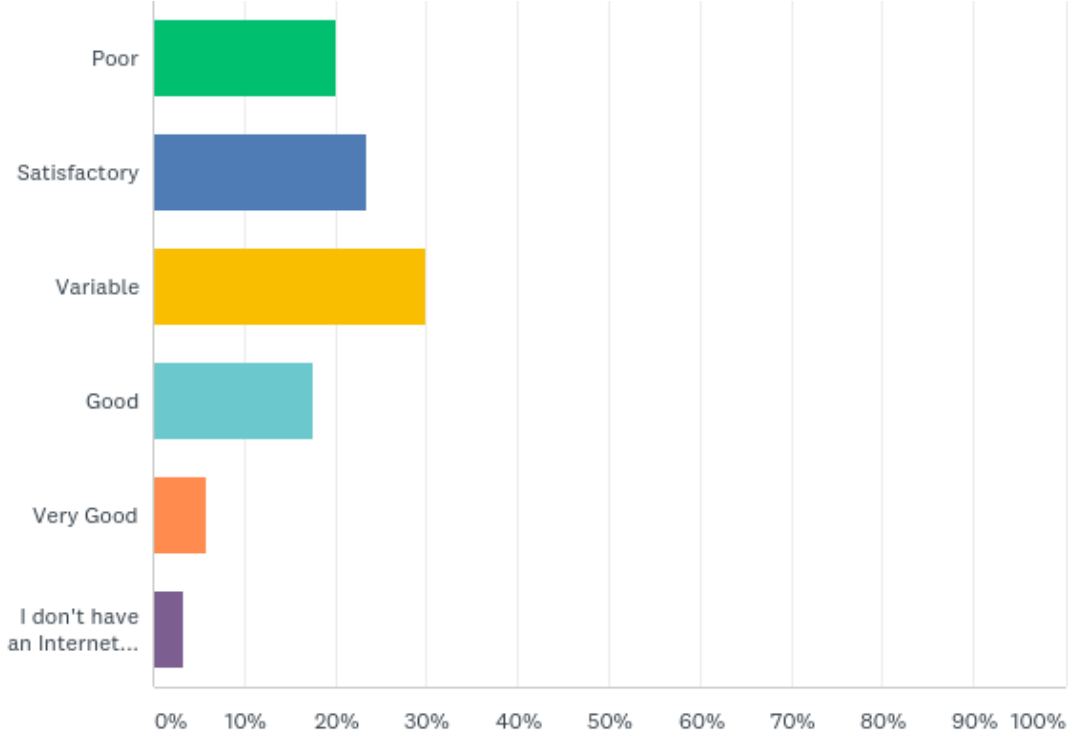




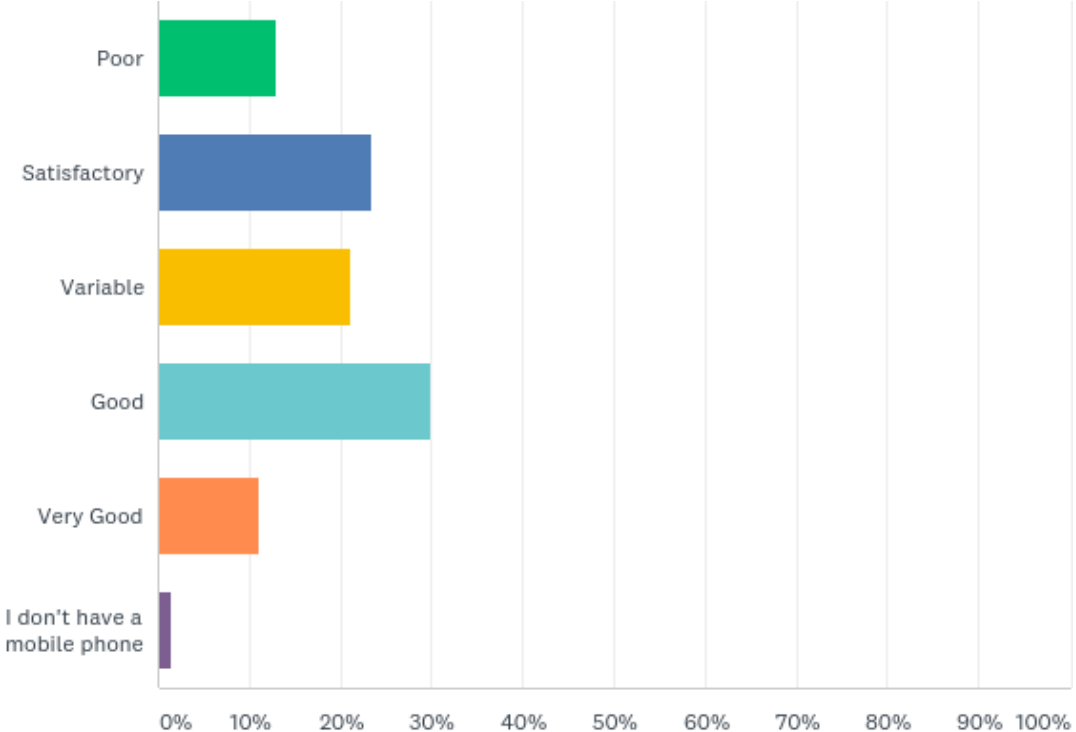
## Q22: How could communication be improved in the village?
