Colleagues,

Firstly, my apologies for there being no newsletter last week. It has been a particularly busy period but hopefully now normal service will be resumed!

Over the past couple of weeks the team have been involved in a number of local policing operations including speed enforcement operations across the New Forest area in conjunction with the local Neighbourhood Policing Teams and a multi-agency road check in co-operation with the Vehicle and Operator Services Agency. Both of these operations were successful with a number of speeding motorists being dealt with and some 14 vehicles being temporarily taken off the road with serious safety defects.

Last week we had a successful outcome in an investigation into illegal fishing practices at a local fishery. A male was interviewed by the Country Watch team and the Environment agency for fishing without purchasing fishing rights and then publishing photos of his catch on social networking sites and catching fish out of season. The suspect, having been caught red handed by police, received a conditional caution for theft of fish and a public apology to various angling organisations will be forthcoming over the next couple of weeks.

Crime figures over the past couple of weeks have shown an increase in equine related crime, theft of equipment, vehicles and even a reported theft of four horses from a field in the Botley area on 1st March. This matter is currently under investigation. If you have any information about this please contact me. Details of the horses are attached. I would urge you to ensure your tack is security marked. We have a tack marking/post coding kit as do your local Horsewatch Co-ordinators and can arrange for you to have use of it for tack marking events if you are interested in running such an event please contact the Country Watch team and we will pass your details onto Hampshire Horsewatch.

Dog thefts have also increased over the past couple of weeks, with three dogs being stolen in the Romsey area in one day. Happily for one owner the dog was located and returned. For the other, however, both dogs remain missing and the owners are understandably beside themselves with worry and are very upset. I would urge you to ensure you keep tabs on your dogs, especially if they are 'outdoors' or working dogs. Take photos of them in case they go missing so they can be circulated and get them microchipped so they are easily identified. Country Watch teams have microchip readers so we can use them to scan any located dogs. Over the past month there has been a number of working spaniels and a couple of border terriers stolen. Be vigilant and report suspicious activity and if you are offered an adult dog where the owner can't give you any history, be wary and get it checked for microchips.

With spring finally appearing to be on the horizon and Easter around the corner, please take this opportunity to check your field and land access points and gateways. Now would be a good time to ensure they are not easily accessed by any unauthorised persons looking for land to set up camp. Ditches, large tree trunks and concrete bollards can all assist in this regard.

Details of Horses Stolen from Botley

Horse 1. 14 years old Bay Gelding. Has white markings on its nose. At the time it went missing it was rugged in a blue Master Rug. It was shod. Warmblood breed - showjumper

Horse 2. 12 years old chestnut gelding white markings on its face. At the time it went missing it was rugged in a blue Master Rug. It was shod. Warmblood breed - showjumper

Horses 3 & 4. 2 x Bay yearling colts with white face. Not shod or rugged. Classed as difficult to handle. Warmblood/welsh cob crosses
