Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Our current priorities are tackling crime and Anti-social behaviour

Total incidents reported: Ashurst – 21 of which 3 were crimes. Lyndhurst - 50 of which 11 were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages, driving complaints and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – Ashurst (3) There was a report of a moped causing a nuisance, a neighbour dispute and door to door sellers. Lyndhurst (1) There was a report of unwanted guests at an organised event.

Assaults – Ashurst (2) There was an incident involving youths that resulted in two allegations of assault. Lyndhurst (2) There were two allegations of assault following domestic incidents.

Burglary – Ashurst (1) There was a burglary in Woodlands. Lyndhurst (2). There was a burglary and an attempt in Emery Down. *Please report any suspicious people you see day and night.*

Burglary (non dwelling) – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (1) A local club was broken into and items were stolen. *Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.*

Criminal Damage – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (1) A car was damaged in a Forest car park.

Drugs – Ashurst (0) Lyndhurst (0)

Public Order – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (0)

Road traffic collisions – Ashurst (1) A pedestrian died following an incident on the A336. Lyndhurst (4) One involved an animal.

Road traffic incidents – Ashurst (2) Two drivers were summonsed for speeding. Lyndhurst (3) Three people were summonsed for speeding offences and an uninsured vehicle was seized.

Theft – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (6) Two mobile phones were stolen and four thefts occurred at commercial premise.

Theft from vehicles – Ashurst (0). Lyndhurst (0) *Please ensure you continue to secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*

Other incidents – A number of suspicious vehicle and people have been reported in the last month. *Please continue to be vigilant and report these incidents*

Speed watch – A total of **1024** vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in April. Of those, **518 (50.5%)** motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit.
